

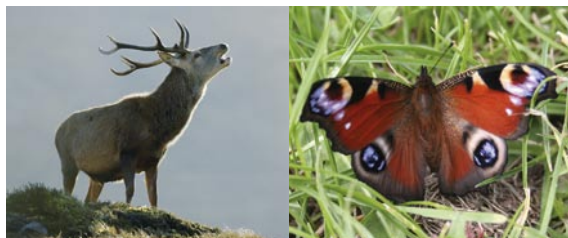

Restoring the Caledonian Forest

Since it was founded in 1989, with vital help from our members, volunteers and corporate partners, Trees for Life has embarked on an ambitious programme of native forest, ecosystem and habitat restoration. To date we have planted over 800,000 trees across our target area and assisted in the regeneration of more than 4,5000 hectares of land.

Trees for Life not only seeks to counteract and reverse the centuries of deforestation which have led to the almost complete loss of Scotland's native woodlands, but also to be pioneers in the newly emerging field of ecological restoration.

Practical Work in the Forest

We work in partnership with other organisations, such as The Forestry Commission Scotland, Scottish Natural Heritage, The National Trust for Scotland, and The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds to establish a coherent, integrated strategy for forest regeneration and to achieve practical results.

More than a thousand volunteers, from teenagers to seventy year olds, have taken part in our forest restoration work. Coming from the local area and abroad, these volunteers have received a powerful experience of working together to make a positive environmental contribution.

In 2000 we received the Millennium Marque award for environmental excellence for the 21st century, while in 1991 we were declared the UK Conservation Project of the year.
