Tour Highlights | Loch Ness Cruise, Glencoe, The Great Glen & Loch Lomond



We begin our day travelling into the Highlands. First stopping on the shores of Loch Lomond and then journeying further north into majestic Glencoe. Here we experience the haunting glen where the 1692 massacre of the MacDonald clan took place, and where 007 himself walked the stunning landscape in James Bond's *Skyfall*.

After a lunch stop in the Fort William area, we continue north, passing breathtaking views of Ben Nevis and the

Caledonian Canal. Loch Ness is our next stop of the day; the well-known body of water is home to 'Nessie', the Loch Ness monster. You have the choice to take a relaxing boat cruise[£] or spend time exploring the beautiful village of Fort Augustus at the foot of the loch.

We then begin our return journey to the lowlands, with a pause for a short refreshment break in the Highland town of Pitlochry before we return to Glasgow.



Loch Lomond, the Trossachs National Park and Stirling Castle


Tour Highlights | Loch Lomond Cruise, Stirling Castle, Aberfoyle & the Trossachs National Park





Departing Glasgow, we travel north to the Trossachs National Park and stop at Loch Lomond, Scotland's largest loch. The area was once home to Scotland's highland folk hero, Rob Roy MacGregor. Here you can choose to take a scenic hour-long cruise[£], taking in views of the islands and surrounding mountains or take time instead to explore the shores of the loch.

From Loch Lomond, we continue in the footsteps of Rob Roy MacGregor and enjoy a refreshment break in Aberfoyle;



a small town nestled in the heart of Scotland's first national park. We then journey to Stirling where we have the opportunity to either explore the city or visit its magnificent castle. Situated high on volcanic rock, the castle offers tales of key historic figures such as William Wallace, Robert the Bruce and Mary Queen of Scots, as well as stunning views of the surrounding landscape.

With lots of interesting things to see and do, Stirling Castle is well worth a visit before we return to Glasgow.

Oban, Glencoe and West Highland Castles

Dour Highlights | Oban, Inveraray and Castle, Glencoe & Loch Lomond

Leaving Glasgow, we journey northwest, travelling through the Highlands and towards the west coast. We reach Inveraray; perched on the banks of Loch Fyne, the town was first established in 1745 by the chief of the Clan Campbell. We stop with time to explore its Castle and Gardens^{£*}, or wander the Georgian streets of the town itself.


Leaving Inveraray, we head north, passing many dramatic scenes such as Kilchurn Castle on Loch Awe. We stop for lunch in Oban with time to explore

and visit McCaig's Folly – Scotland's version of the Colosseum.

Passing by Castle Stalker on Loch Laich, we will then reach the famous Glencoe Valley. This is the haunting glen where the 1692 massacre of the MacDonald clan took place. It also features in the Harry Potter films and in the opening credits for the TV series. Outlander.


The final stop will be on the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond in the small village of Luss, before heading back to Glasgow.
















Glenfinnan, Mallaig and Glencoe Adventure

Tour Highlights | Glenfinnan Viaduct, Jacobite Steam Train, Glencoe & Mallaig

We begin our tour journeying north, hugging the shoreline of Loch Lomond and travelling through the Trossachs National Park. We stop at Glencoe, famous for the massacre of the MacDonald clan, and the filming location of James Bond's *Skyfall* and *Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban*.

We then travel further north, pausing in the Fort William area for refreshments before we reach the Road to the Isles or 'Rathad nan Eilean'. The area is said to have some of the most spectacular scenery in the world, with sandy beaches and dramatic hills. At the end of the road, we reach Mallaig, a scenic fishing port.



Spend time here for lunch and enjoy the sea views. We then travel eastwards to see the highlight of our day, the Glenfinnan Viaduct. We arrive in time to see the Jacobite Steam Train* cross the bridge, don't forget your camera for that iconic photo! The area has wonderful views across Loch Shiel, which you might recognise as the setting for Hogwarts. The Glenfinnan area was also where Bonnie Prince Charlie launched the 1745 Jacobite Rebellion.

After Glenfinnan, our tour turns south, with a comfort break near the shores of Loch Lomond at Tarbet, before returning to Glasgow.

Glenfinnan, Fort William and Glencoe Adventure – Winter Edition

Tour Highlights | Glenfinnan Viaduct & Monument, Glencoe, Fort William, Loch Lomond



We start our day by journeying north past the shores of Loch Lomond, before arriving at our first stop of the day; Tyndrum, where we will have a short break. Then, it's onwards to the dramatic Glencoe valley, the well-known, dramatic glen features as the backdrop to many films and you will have the chance to grab some spectacular photos here as you learn about the 1692 massacre of the MacDonald clan. From atmospheric Glencoe, we journey on to the Glenfinnan Viaduct. Arguably most famous from its scenes in Harry Potter, the Glenfinnan Viaduct stands



also served as the 'Black Lake' in the films. From here you can also see the Glenfinnan Monument, which symbolises one of the most important events in Scottish history; the 1745 Jacobite Uprising.

Departing Glenfinnan, we begin our journey back to Glasgow, stopping at the town of Fort William which sits at the foot of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain. After grabbing some lunch or taking in the sights of the town, we continue our journey back to Glasgow with a short stop at Tarbet on the shores of Loch Lomond.


Eilean Donan Castle, Loch Ness and the North West Highlands

Tour Highlights | Eilean Donan Castle, Wallace Monument, Glencoe, Loch Ness & Glenfinnan Viaduct



Enjoy two days in the Highlands; experience dramatic landscapes rich in history and enjoy an overnight stay in the Highland town of Fort William.

DAY ONE: Explore the Wallace Monument[£], the towering stone testimonial to William Wallace, Scotland's great Freedom Fighter depicted in *Braveheart*. We pass by Doune Castle, filming location for the TV series *Outlander* and the movie *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*. Journey to Glencoe, site of the massacre of the MacDonald clan, and end your day at the Glenfinnan Viaduct, made famous by the *Harry Potter* films (Apr-Oct).



DAY TWO: After breakfast, pass by the Great Glen, Loch Ness, and visit Eilean Donan Castle[£], one of Scotland's most photographed castles. Afterwards, stop for lunch at Loch Ness and visit the Commando Memorial at the foot of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain. Journey homewards, enjoying photo stops through the Highlands before crossing the Forth Road Bridge back to Edinburgh

After lunch, we pause for photos at Britain's highest mountain, Ben Nevis. We pass the stunning Five Sisters of Kintail mountain ridge, and end our day in Portree, where we check into our accommodation.
